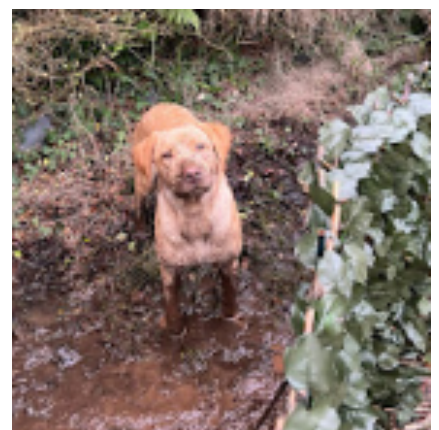
Year 4 and Year 6 children have been assisting Mr Murphy, in preparing the grounds for further tree planting on the community day. Whilst the temperatures have been below freezing, the soil has remained unfrozen, which means our planting of native mixed species hedgerows can continue. This will create a green corridor around the field's perimeter, to encourage more wildlife, especially birds, whilst also soaking up excess water on the field, making the school more secure and improving privacy.

RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch

This week, Mrs Murphy and Year 4, armed with binoculars and bird identification books, took part in the RSPB's Big School Bird Watch. We had been filling up our bird feeders with sunflower seeds, whilst also putting out dried meal worms and suet pellets, to encourage birds to our school grounds in readiness.

This preparation paid off, as we spotted 12 species of birds, including chaffinches, pied wagtails, a male pheasant, black headed gulls, herring gulls and several birds from the tit family, including blue and great. Our results will be entered into the RSPB's national data base, which helps to build a picture of UK bird populations. Well done Year 4!



We encourage all families to join in, and take part in the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch at home. Sadly, **in the UK we have lost 38 million birds** in the last 60 years (RSPB, n.d), so they really need our



help! If you would like to know more about how you can help birds, please have a look at last week's newsletter on the school website, within which we covered this in detail. Particular birds that you might find in your garden, but are currently declining, are: house sparrows, green finches, chaffinches, starlings and song thrushes. This is mostly due to habitat loss, climate change, pollution and intensive farming, but chaffinches and greenfinches are also affected by a disease called trichomonosis. This is spread easily when bird feeders are not cleaned regularly. Although some birds, such as wood pigeons, nuthatches, great tits, long tailed tits and goldfinches are increasing, due to people feeding the birds and putting bird boxes up. In fact, **the UK puts out more bird food than the rest of Europe**

combined, which supports 196 million birds (BTO, 2019), demonstrating just how important this simple act is. Interestingly, one of the fastest increasing species of UK bird has been the ring-necked parakeet, which has spread to Southampton from London, and may soon be seen in North Baddesley!

Pen Recycling

Eco Committee finished designing their classroom pen bins, and these are now in every classroom. We found out that old pens are taken in bulk to a factory, which chops them up into small pieces, sorts out the non-plastic bits and melts them into plastic boards. These are then moulded into items including garden benches. Eco Committee are now planning fund raising activities, as we would love to purchase a 'Pen Bench' for our school. In the right spot, this could be a perfect bird spotting seat!
