




Goodbyes

Eco Committee

With World Frog Day coming up next month, Year 4 found out lots of interesting froggy facts, and made their frogs for our big frog display.

Did you know that toads are actually a type of frog? Also, frogs are found on every continent of the world except Antarctica! The UK has two native species of frog – Common and Pool frogs.

It is also not too late to send in your frog creations and pictures, as Mrs Murphy is planning a display of these interesting

creatures, to highlight the need for their conservation.

At home you can help frogs and other amphibians, by creating a wildlife pond and/or bog garden. This will provide them with suitable breeding spots, which is key to help increase populations. You should also avoid using pesticides, as these can posion the insects and slugs that frogs like to eat.





Gardening Club

Due to the awful weather, the gardeners enjoyed a little paddle in the puddles, after they had finished preparing our raised beds. The staff room teabags and fruit snack leftovers, which have been building up in our compost bins last year, made wonderful mulch

and natural fertiliser, which was added into the soil to provide plenty of nutrients for our crops. We also planted some garlic in pots, which will be planted out in the raised beds, once it starts to shoot and the frosts have finished.
