

Eco News



Despite the drizzle, Year 4 enjoyed a busy afternoon of outdoor activities this week to support our next RSPB School Wild Award. We looked at different

birds and investigated what food they prefer by watching quietly. Robins and blackbirds definitely preferred mealworms whereas the magpies loved pecking at the suet pellets!

Did you know that mealworms are not really worms? They are in fact, dried beetle larvae and they are fantastic to feed to birds as they are a great source of protein.

We looked at information on seed packets, to discover what seeds can be planted at this time of year. This week, we sowed two varieties of sweet peas, a dwarf and a tall variety and a few broad beans - seeds collected from last season. We used cardboard roll tubes instead of plastic plant pots. These are really eco, they can be planted directly into the soil once the seeds have germinated and produced a shoot as the cardboard will break down in the earth. Growing flowers in our veggie patch is a good way to encourage insects as they will help to pollinate our bean plants plus other vegetable and fruit plants.
