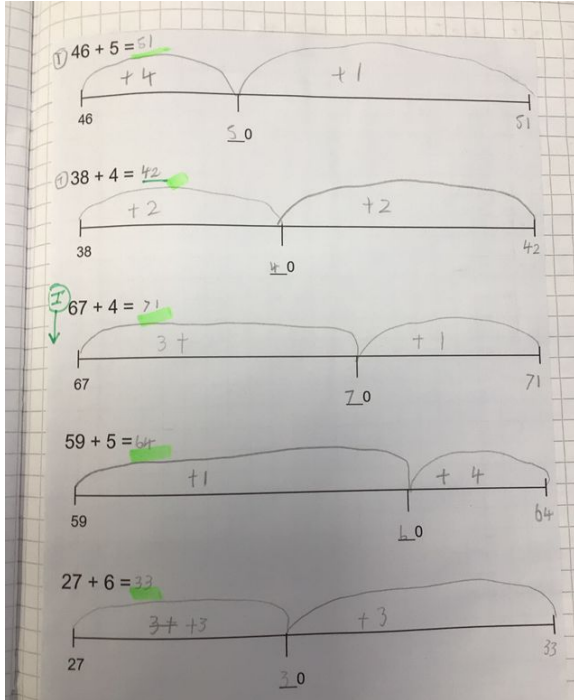

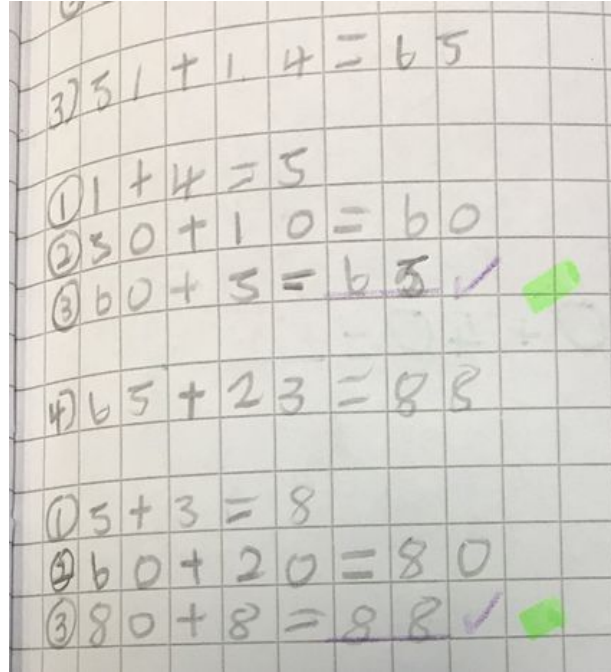


Year 3 Maths

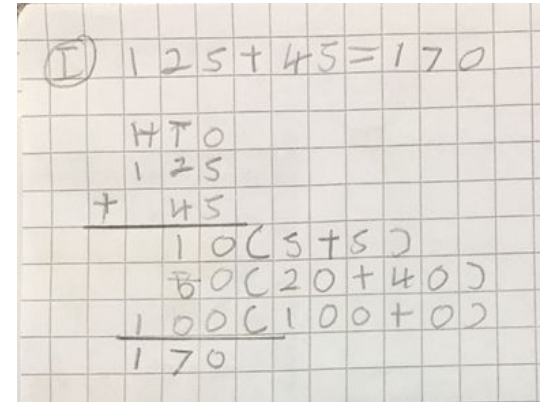
Addition on a number line



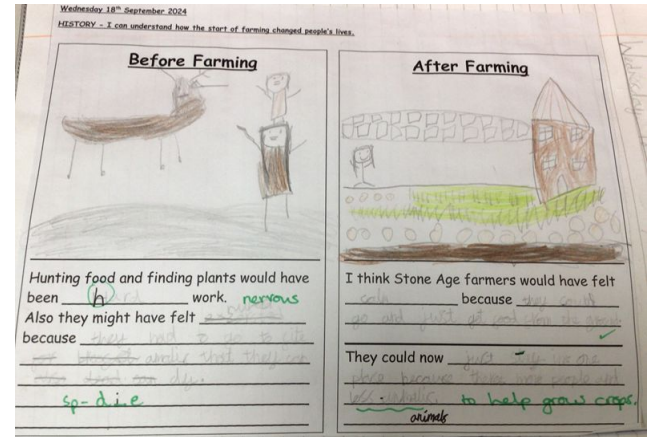
Addition by partitioning



Addition formal column method



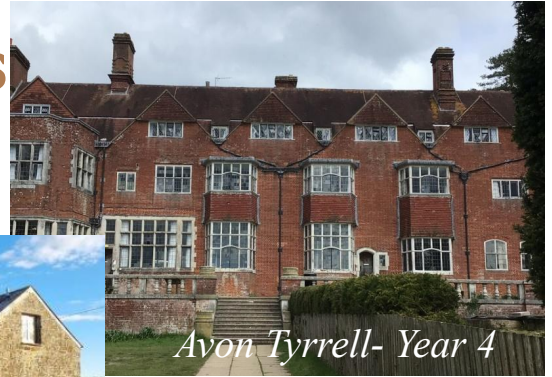

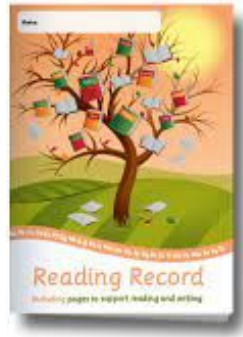

- Home learning will be set through our **online platform – Google Apps**. We use the feature **Google Classroom**.




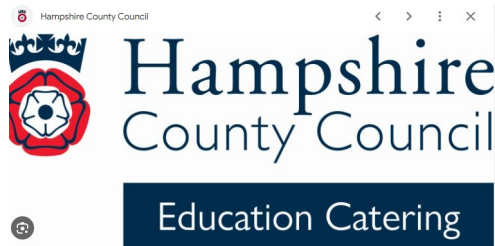

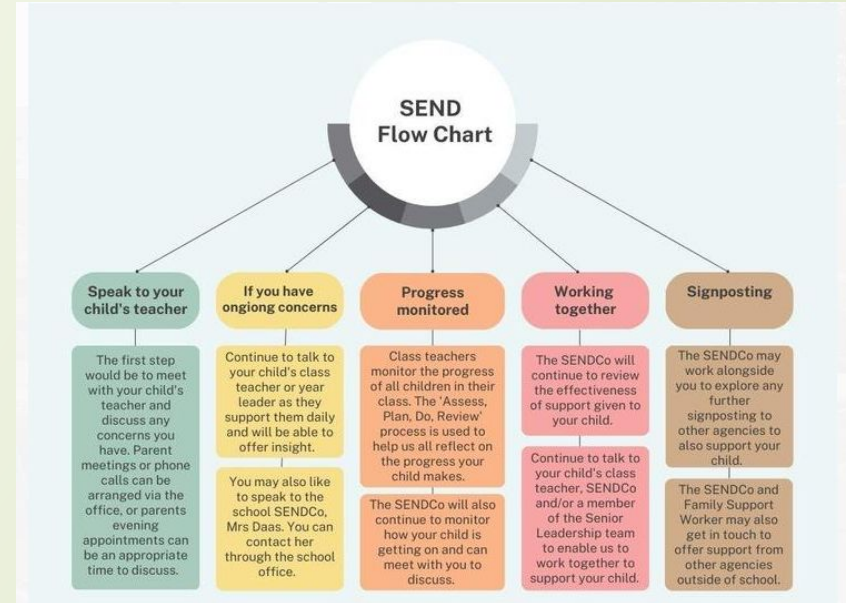

Admission Policy



North Baddesley Junior School Admission Policy 2025-2026

Hampshire County Council is the admission authority for North Baddesley Junior School. The admission arrangements are determined by the County Council, after statutory consultations.

This policy will be used during 2024/25 for allocating places in the main admission round for entry to Year 3 in September 2025. It will also apply to in-year admissions during 2025/26.

Published Admission Number (PAN)

Each junior school has a published admission number (PAN)¹ for entry to Year 3. The school will admit this number of children if there are sufficient applications. Where there are fewer applications than the published admission number, places will be offered to all applicants.

The PAN for North Baddesley Junior School for 2025-2026 is **90**

Guidance to apply for a school place in year R reception and year 3 junior school




1 How it works

- You can name up to three schools on your application, in order of preference
- Your child is added to a list for each of the schools you have named. Each schools list is then ranked in accordance with the published admission criteria for that school to determine whether they are able to offer a place
- If only one of your preferred schools can offer a place, you will be allocated a place at that school
- If your child qualifies for a place at more than one school, the one ranked highest on your application will be allocated
- If none of your preferred schools can offer a place, you will be allocated a place at the catchment school (if places remain) or the nearest school (measured as a straight line) with a place available. You will also be advised of the arrangements for placing your child on the waiting list and your right of appeal
