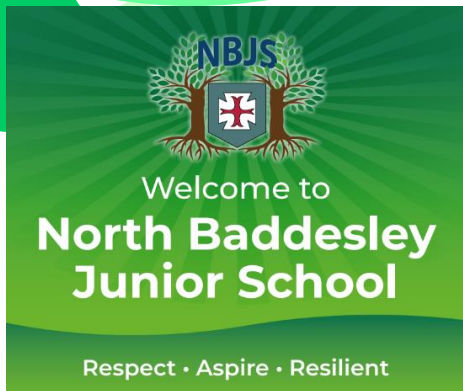

## Communication

As the leader of the school, my main job is making sure your child is safe, happy and reaching their potential. Families make an important contribution to their child's achievement at school and I know that a successful and happy school depends on all of us working together. Please come and talk to us if there are any concerns or queries that you have. At the end of the school day, teachers will continue to bring the children out and this is always a good time to discuss any queries or worries informally. If you wish to arrange a more formal meeting with your child's class teacher, year leader, assistant head teacher or myself then please book an appointment via the school office. We have attached the parent communication flowchart to help guide parents on the communication channels in school.

As I go through some of the 'housekeeping', I apologise for any reminders that you are already aware of; however, as always there are a few slight changes to procedures that need to be shared before the term starts.

## Attendance, Absences and Safeguarding

It is extremely important that your child has the best possible attendance. School for the children starts on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> September and doors will be opened at 8.40. Registration takes place at 8.50. Prefects will close the doors at 8.50. Any child that arrives after 8.50 will need to go through reception and will be marked in the register as late. Please note that regular lateness can trigger a fine or referral.

If your child is absent, please let the office know via a phone call (message can be left on the absence line) or through parent mail. Please can we kindly request that you do not email the school office account regarding absences. The office/home support worker will contact you if you have not already informed us as to why your child is not in school – this is standard procedure. For absences to be authorised for appointments (e.g., dentist, doctors) then we will need you to provide evidence confirming this to ensure that the correct code is assigned to the absence.

Holidays will not be authorised; however, a leave of absence form must be filled in and submitted before you take your child outside of school during term time; this ensures transparency and gives the school time to inform parents of the attendance policies and procedures. Holiday forms can be collected from the school office or downloaded off the website. Parents that are thinking about taking their child out of school for a period of time are advised to read the updated guidance and [information on penalty notices for non-attendance at school](#).

## Safeguarding

Please can we ask that parents and children **do not** come onto the school site (unless going to reception or Kidzplay) before **8.40**. The playground gates will be locked to safeguard the children that will be on site for morning clubs and Kidzplay.

**Please note** that there will be no access via the Junior School Playground to the Infant School and vice versa before 8:40. Gates will be opened from 8.40 – 9.00. Gates will then be locked until 3:10. The gates will be unlocked from 3:10 until 3:30. At 3:30 the playground gates will be locked to ensure

that the children staying on site are safeguarded. There will be no access via the playground to the infant school from 3:30 onwards.

### Kidzplay – Wrap Around Care at NBJs

Kidzplay starts on **Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> September** for those that have signed up. If you wish to sign up, please do so via the following link. <https://www.kidzplayuk.co.uk>. Kidzplay. Please drop off and pick up your child via the year 5 door near reception. If you ring the bell a member of staff will come and assist you.

### Ordering Lunches

At the junior school children have the option of bringing in their own packed lunch or ordering a school dinner from one of three daily choices. Children will continue to order their lunches via their class teacher each morning. The menu is displayed in every classroom - the class teacher will happily guide the children. You can also share the education catering [daily menu](#) with your child at home. Unlike the infant phase, all dinners have to be paid for. The cost of a school dinner is currently £3.20. Please ensure that you have registered your child if you believe you are entitled to free school meals. <https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals>. If you are entitled to free school meals but you have not registered then you will need to pay for your child's school dinner.

### Tuck Shop

The tuck shop will continue to be open at break times. Items range from 20p to a £1. The tuck shop is cash operated by Education Catering and the staff monitor the children's choices.

### Payments

We prefer for parents to pay for school dinners and trips online; however, cash or cheques are accepted in a named envelope. If you encounter issues paying online or setting up your account, please speak to the school office who will always be happy to help.

### Clubs

Attached to this newsletter is the club offering for **Autumn Term Clubs**. We try to offer a range of opportunities throughout the year to all year groups. Some clubs you sign up to directly with the provider (Gym, Football, Hula Dance, Karate, Tennis and Spanish.) Please look out for separate communication regarding clubs and how to sign up for them; some links are attached within the timetable. For school led clubs a sign up form will be sent out shortly. Unfortunately, some clubs may be oversubscribed and places are limited; therefore, they will be offered on a first come first served basis. We apologise in advance for any disappointment.

### Medicines.

Please can we remind parents that all medications e.g. inhalers, auto injectors, antihistamine etc... must be handed into reception with [the relevant paperwork](#) on the first day of term.

### Library

Weekly access to the school library. Children can take out two books at a time. Our librarian (Mrs Parkes) will open up the library on Tuesday after school until 4pm for parents to come and choose

books with their children. I encourage parents to use this facility, as our librarian is always happy to help guide children in their choice of books. Mrs Parkes will also try to hire in books that children would love to read.

Having replaced a lot of lost books this summer, we will unfortunately have to charge for lost and damaged books. We will discuss with the children the importance of looking after library books in class and through our weekly assemblies. If you ever have any queries about a book, please ask to speak to our librarian who will always be happy to help.

#### Jewellery and school uniform

Our [school uniform statement of practice](#) can be found on our school website. Please can we remind parents that trainers are not permitted as school shoes and school shoes must be all black. In addition, the only jewellery permitted to be worn is stud earrings and a watch. All jewellery should be removed for any physical activities including PE/games lessons; specifically, earrings must be removed (not covered with tape) to avoid risk of accident and injury. As such, parents are asked to consider the timings of any new piercings carefully in relation to the time required for safe removal. Lessons may have to be adapted if your child cannot take out their earrings.

#### Smart Watches

For safeguarding reasons, smart watches that can take photos, record and make phone calls are not permitted to be worn during the school day. Watches that tell the time and/or only have the capacity to monitor fitness and steps are permitted.

#### Walking independently to and from school

We want to keep you informed about our new collection procedures for pupils in Years 3 to 6 at our school. For parents of children in Years 3 and 4, we kindly ask that a trusted adult is present for the collection of your child at the end of the school day.

For parents of children in Years 5 and 6, if you prefer your child to walk home independently, you must have completed the waiver on Arbor. This waiver is a blanket agreement, meaning that by signing it, you are giving your consent for your child to walk home on their own daily. The school will not permit children to walk home independently on specific days unless the waiver has been signed. If you have signed the waiver but would still prefer your child to wait at the school gates, please ensure your child understands this arrangement and is aware of your wishes.

We appreciate your cooperation and support in ensuring the safety and well-being of all our pupils.

#### Mobile Phones – a waiver is needed

We would prefer children not to bring mobile phones into school; however, we recognise there are occasions when children may need to bring a mobile phone to school. If you feel that your child needs to bring their phone into school then you **must** come and sign a waiver in the office. [A new waiver is needed every academic year.](#)

Children, who have permission to bring their phone in need to place it in a named jiffy bag and this should be handed in to Reception before the start of the school day. The phone must be turned off. Any phones found in school bags or seen during the school day will be confiscated and parents will be required to collect it from the school office. Please note, that the school accepts no responsibility for any loss or damage to a mobile phone whilst the device is on the school premises. This brings us into line with practices in place at secondary school.

### Daily Active Mile

As in previous years, we will all continue to participate in the Active Mile. This is a national initiative which encourages all children to be active. There is no pressure for the children to run, all we ask is that the children walk at their own pace during the 15 minutes. For those that wish to run, we encourage them to change into their trainers at lunchtime rather than wear their black school shoes. If for any reason your child cannot take part in PE or other physical activities in school then a note needs to be provided. Children that are running around and playing during their lunchtimes are expected to participate in the active mile.

### Values Assemblies

We are always looking at ways to invite parents into the school. Every week, we hold a values assembly where we celebrate the hard work and dedication of the children. We would like to continue to invite parents to these special weekly assemblies. If your child has been selected to receive a values award, you will be informed (via Parentmail) the week before. If you are able to, we would love for you to join us for the assembly the following week. Ideally, we would ask that you kept this quiet so it is a nice surprise for your child when they come into assembly. The assemblies start at 9:00 and are approximately 30 minutes.

### Dates for your Diary

We have a very busy calendar already for this academic year and I fully understand how busy life is. To help, I have attached the dates of all the planned events so far for this academic year. I am sure that more will be added as the year goes on and letters about the different events will be sent out nearer the time.

The staff and I are looking forward to working with you all over the coming year. We will see you bright and early on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> September. Years 4 & 6 will enter through the gate adjacent to the kitchen, Year 5 by the door next to Reception (and upstairs), and Year 3 by the wooded area. Adults are asked not to enter the school through pupil doors.

## North Baddesley Junior School Mobile Phone Agreement

### NBS Pupil Mobile Phone Agreement



North Baddesley Junior School recognises that on some occasions it may be helpful for a pupil to bring a mobile phone into school, for instance, if they walk to school unaccompanied or a different carer is collecting them. We believe that pupil use of a mobile phone during the school day can be disruptive and can pose a safeguarding risk and this agreement outlines how pupil phones will be managed within our school.

- All pupils bringing a phone into school must have a good reason for doing so, and must have returned this agreement to the school office.
- All phones must be handed into the office before registration each morning.
- Phones will be handed to the children by the class teacher at the end of the day. Phones are not to be turned on until they are off the school site.
- The school will help children to learn about staying safe online, but recognises that the primary responsibility for online safety at home lies with parents/carers. The school will seek to work with families to help them to encourage children to adopt safe use of mobile technology.
- Children not following these rules will not be allowed to bring a phone into school. Any phone brought in without permission will be confiscated and only returned to a parent or carer.
- Children must not take photographs or videos of people on school grounds and never to take them on the way to or from school. This is because some children are not allowed to have their picture taken.
- All phones should be turned off before handing in.
- The school cannot accept responsibility for damage or loss of a mobile phone brought into school.]
- The school has the right to confiscate or search a mobile phone. In the unlikely event of needing to do this, we will endeavor to contact a parent or carer. As part of this agreement, your child should agree to unlock the phone if required by a member of staff.
