Please be assured that these will soon become a natural part of their daily school life. We have been impressed with the children's smart presentation and their enthusiastic approach as they begin this new stage of learning.

Year 3 Information and Reminders

- **Morning arrival (8:40 a.m.)** – The school doors at the end of the Year 3 path will open at 8:40 a.m. A prompt start ensures that all children have sufficient time to organise themselves for the day ahead and to complete their first learning task.
- **End of the day (3:20 p.m.)** – School finishes at 3:20 p.m. Children will be accompanied down the Year 3 path by their class teacher. This is a good opportunity if you wish to speak briefly with the teacher. For longer discussions, please contact the school office via email to reach your child's class teacher or to arrange a more formal appointment.
- **Collection arrangements** – If your child is being collected by a different adult, we kindly ask that you inform the school office in advance. They will ensure the class teacher is made aware of the change.

On **Wednesday 17th September**, we will be holding a Year 3 Information Meeting. During this session, we will outline home learning expectations, discuss routines, share timetables, and provide an opportunity to answer any questions you may have.

Please ensure that your child has the correct PE kit on the designated days. This should include non-logo black shorts, a plain t-shirt in their house colour, and for the colder months, a non-logo dark jumper and tracksuit bottoms, along with trainers. We also ask that long hair is tied back and that earrings are removed for physical activity. If this is not possible, we kindly suggest that earrings are not worn on PE days.

Reading Diaries

Each child will be provided with a reading diary to record their reading at home. We ask that children read at least four times per week, either to an adult or independently. Each recorded read will earn them raffle tickets, giving them the opportunity to win free books. Reading diaries will be checked during the week by the class teacher.

Home Learning

Home Learning will be set for the whole school via Google Classroom. Each child will receive their own login details, which will be sent home once they have been introduced to the platform in class.

Home Learning will be set every **Thursday** and is due in the following **Tuesday**.

Tasks will include:

- **Spellings:** a weekly rule with practice activities.
- **Maths:** arithmetic practice, consolidation of class learning, or times tables work on Times Table Rock Stars.
- **Reading:** 4–5 times per week, recorded in the diary and initialled by an adult.

We ask that if you experience any technical issues, you approach the class teacher at the end of the day before the Home Learning is due in.
